# Lakewomen Take 8<sup>th</sup> Straight Title

Something weird happened to the Lakewomen this year... they lost a League game. Wilson's 62-game Niagara Orleans league winning streak was snapped by Medina earlier this season. The streak stretched over six seasons during which the Lakewomen won seven straight league titles. Following that loss, Wilson regained momentum and won their 8<sup>th</sup> straight League Championship. The season has been a lot of fun for the team from our early season trip to the Southern Tier and our own Wilson Showcase to senior Rachel Senek becoming the 2<sup>nd</sup> all-time leading scorer in Wilson history, reaching 1000 career points at home vs. Albion. The girls seemed to gain confidence and strength as the season went on and began playing their best basketball when it mattered most. The team entered Sectionals as the #3 seed and quickly became a favorite after knocking off perennial powerhouse Southwestern in a quarterfinal game at the Zipp. The girls then beat a strong Buffalo Arts team 60-58 at Sweet Home high school. From there it was back to Buffalo State College to play league foe Medina the only league opponent to beat the Lakewomen this year. Wilson would not be denied, beating Medina convincingly 60-33 for the Sectional B2 title! Although the team would lose to Fredonia in the B Crossover game, the season was again a huge success!

### Wrestlers Make Huge Strides

The Wrestling team had a strong finish to the year after a bit of a slow start. With half of the team being first year wrestlers, the team held up well against tough competition both in the league and in the section. We are fortunate to have a young, eager team that is compiled of four 8th graders, seven Freshmen, four Sophomores and five Juniors. Although the team ended with a 3-12 record, we finished the year with 3 guys earning at least 20 wins and 6 guys with over a .500 record. The team individually compiled a record of 144-168 record as a team and recorded 76 of those wins as pins. The team picked up its first league win since 2013 and look to improve next year. Out of the 9 tournaments we competed in, we had 37 place finishers in total. During those tournaments, we had three individual champions. Junior Matt Lange won the Medina Round Robin Tournament at 220lbs. Junior, Jake Sanborn won the N/O League at 120lbs. Sophomore, KJ Hoover won our Class D Sectionals at 152lbs. The standout wrestler of the year was Junior Aaron Weich at 182lbs. Weich finished 5th at Lockport, 2nd at the Medina, 3rd in the N/O League, 4th at Class D sectionals and 6th at the Small School State Qualifier.

# Varsity Boys Basketball Led by Impressive Senior Class

The boys' varsity team finished the season with an overall record of 11-9 and a league record of 7-5. The team placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the N-O League. A few highlights this season included winning the Wilson Tip-Off Tournament for the first time since 2008 and playing a dozen games that were determined by 4 points or less. The team exemplified the true meaning of a scholar athlete by compiling a team GPA of 93% and earning the scholar/athlete award.

The team was involved in several community volunteer projects including working at a local soup kitchen, helping collect food for the local food pantry with the girls' basketball team, assisting in the annual senior citizens breakfast, and helping with the local youth basketball league.

# JV Boys Basketball Prepares for the Next Level

The JV Boys Basketball season has been a nail biter from start to finish as half of our games have been decided by 5 points or less, including a pair of gritty overtime games. The play of the JV men has been impressive considering there were no returning starters from the prior season. The team of 14 players is led by four Sophomore Captains: Cal Seeley, Jon Littere, Jacob Miller and Jackson Rotella. They have been excellent leaders and tutors to our young team.

As a team, we are very balanced as scorers. In 15 of our games we have had 6 or more players score and in 7 of those games we had 7 or more players score. The statistical leaders are Rotella (10 pts/gm), Miller (8.5 pts/gm), Cal Seeley (8.2 pts/gm). The leading rebounders are Rotella (9.1 rb/gm), Brayden Thompson (6.3 rb/gm) and Miller (3.3 rb/gm), each player has contributed as all of them have at least 1 rebound.

These men bring a great balance of ability to score, play aggressive defense, work as a team, and give maximum effort. There have been many exciting games with a big win over Albion in OT, wins over Roy-Hart and Akron, 2 big wins over Barker and a nice non-league win over a very athletic CSAT team. In games that we have trailed these men simply did not give up. They battled to the final buzzer in each game regardless of the score. We battled back from 4 down against Albion for the OT win, and gave outstanding efforts to tough Grand Island and Health Sciences teams. We battled back from a 13 pt deficit starting the 4<sup>th</sup> qtr against an excellent Niagara Wheatfield team, only to miss a close 3pt shot at the buzzer to tie. We didn't win every game but these players simply did not quit.

Our 4 valued sophomore leaders will move up to Varsity play next year. We wish them well. However, we have a stable of talented young players who have stepped in many games this year to contribute.
