DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS

The Wilson Board of Education will consider all applications. The board is seeking an educational leader of the highest professional and personal integrity with the following minimum qualifications:

- New York State certification as a School District Administrator
- Successful experience as a classroom teacher and principal as well as experience in a central office is preferred
- Prior experience as a superintendent is desirable, and experience in New York State is highly preferable
- Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with the community, the Board of Education, and the staff to build credibility and trust for the District

The ideal candidate will have the standard skills required for success as a superintendent in a progressive district (business, human resources, operations, management, etc.). In addition, the board is particularly interested in candidates who have/will:

- A strong commitment to the District and the position
- Demonstrate a high level of visibility within the District and to the development of strong and ongoing positive relationships between the District and community
- Experience with instructional leadership and gap closing strategies in a high performing district
- A track record of success at reaching out to work successfully with school stakeholders
- Vision, creativity, resourcefulness, integrity, and follow-through in all dealings with the Board of Education, community, staff, students & parents, while challenging them to achieve

goals in a dynamic and supportive student-centered school environment

- Knowledge and skills in the application of the role of technology in education, education law, planning procedures, the management of facilities and contract management/negotiations
- A strong financial and personnel background with the ability to marshal resources to the benefit of the instructional program
- Be energetic and possess strong communication and presentation skills



OUR COMMUNITY

The Wilson Central School District encompasses approximately 144 square miles in northern Niagara County, on the shores of Lake Ontario. Centralized in 1935, the district contains all or parts of the Town and Village of Wilson, Cambria, Porter (including the Hamlet of Ransomville), and Newfane. About 66% of the District's taxable property falls within the Town and Village of Wilson, while the Towns of Cambria and Porter make up approximately 33% of the assessed value of the District. The Town of Newfane is less than 1% of the total District. The schools are a focal point of the community for the young and old.

Western New York's business newspaper, <u>Business First</u>, lists the area's major employers as: county, state, and federal governments, Dunlop Tire Company in Amherst & Tonawanda, and Mahle/GM, Many district residents are also employed by Niagara County Community College, Orleans/Niagara BOCES, and area school districts.

The area is noted for its recreational activities including boating, hunting, fishing, and hiking. Buffalo and Niagara Falls may be reached in a half-hour, while Rochester and Toronto are within two hours driving distance.

THE DISTRICT

The Wilson Central School District provides an excellent comprehensive, fundamental educational program fostering traditional values, as well as innovative and mandated specialized programs to meet individual student needs. WCSD prides itself on its proven ability to teach children to read, write, and compute well. There is a strong focus on improvement at all levels. Three school buildings house the District's 1,147 pupil K-12 enrollment. The Wilson CSD campus is comprised of the Senior High School housing 403 pupils, the Middle School with 269 pupils, and the Elementary School with 468 pupils.

Wilson Central School District is a member of the Orleans/Niagara Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES). The district offers strong academic and vocational programs including AP courses, two foreign languages, Study Skills, and Computer Science. College credit bearing courses are available to senior high students in English,

Biology, Computer Science, Mathematics, and the Sciences. A well-rounded program of extracurricular activities in Athletics, Music, and Art augment the

District's instructional mission.
